Questions to ask	Things to think about
1. WHO?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Author is clearly identified<input type="checkbox"/> Author is an expert in this area<input type="checkbox"/> Contact information is listed<input type="checkbox"/> A reliable organization is connected to this web site
2. WHAT?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Purpose of the web site is clear<input type="checkbox"/> Site explains the topic thoroughly<input type="checkbox"/> Information is easily read and understood
3. WHY?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Site presents a balanced point of view, rather than pushing a particular perspective<input type="checkbox"/> The point of view is fair<input type="checkbox"/> Site does not contain advertising
4. WHEN?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Date of creation/update is available<input type="checkbox"/> The information is current<input type="checkbox"/> All links work
5. HOW?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Facts stated can be checked and confirmed using other sources<input type="checkbox"/> Site is free of errors<input type="checkbox"/> Site is easy to navigate
