SOUTHERN LADY CODE (Helen Ellis; read by Helen Ellis) - 3 hours 12 minutes

Enter the hilarious and inventive mind of Helen Ellis. The bestselling author of *American Housewife* teaches listeners her technique by which, if you don't have something nice to say, you say something not so nice...in a nice way. While listening, you'll encounter her thoughts on marriage and manners, thank-you notes and three-ways, ghosts, gynecology, and the monogrammed art of living as a Southern Lady.

EXIT WEST (Mohsin Hamid; read by Mohsin Hamid) - 4 hours 42 minutes

Exit West is a visionary love story written and read by Mohsin Hamid. In a country on the brink of civil war, Nadia and Saeed meet and embark on a passionate love affair. But when violence breaks out in the streets, the neighborhood they once intimately knew is left unrecognizable and they must decide if they will stay, or leave their homeland behind.

MY SISTER, THE SERIAL KILLER (Oyinkan Braithwaite; read by Adepero Oduye) - 4 hours 15 minutes

A short, darkly funny, hand grenade of a novel about a Nigerian woman whose younger sister has a very inconvenient habit of killing her boyfriends. Sharp as nails and full of deadpan wit, Oyinkan Braithwaite's deliciously deadly debut is as fun as it is frightening.

MEATY (Samantha Irby; read by Samantha Irby) - 7 hours 40 minutes

Samantha Irby laughs her way through tragicomic mishaps, neuroses, and taboos as she struggles through adulthood: chin hairs, depression, bad sex, failed relationships, masturbation, taco feasts, inflammatory bowel disease and more. This much-beloved romp is a treat for anyone in dire need of Irby's infamous, scathing wit and poignant candor.

BROTHER AND SISTER (Diane Keaton; read by Diane Keaton) - 4 hours 30 minutes

In this deeply personal book, written and read by the beloved actress Diane Keaton, Keaton explores the bonds between siblings. Growing up, she and her brother Randy were best friends, spending all of their time together. But as Randy grew older, he became more and more reclusive. Here Keaton contemplates the inner workings of a family, the ties that hold it together, and the special bond between siblings even when they are pulled far apart.

RED AT THE BONE (Jacqueline Woodson; read by Jacqueline Woodson, Quincy Tyler Bernstine, Peter Francis James, Shayna Small and Bahni Turpin) - 3 hours 53 minutes

Two families from different social classes are joined together by an unexpected pregnancy and the child that it produces. Moving forward and backward in time, with the power of poetry and the emotional richness of a narrative ten times its length, Jacqueline Woodson's extraordinary novel uncovers the role that history and community have played in the experiences, decisions, and relationships of these families, and in the life of this child.

Many authors will attend these festivals with their most recent releases - maybe you would enjoy curating your own collection of authored books!!

Eden Mills writers Festival

This wonderful festival is taking place in Eden Mills just outside of Guelph. Keep an eye on their website as the organizers will post information for the 2025 festival. The format is very informal and multiple authors will be providing insight into their writing process, reading from their most recent publication and so much more.

<u>GritLit</u>

GritLit is a four day event held in downtown Hamilton. Participants can attend writing master classes, author readings and so much more. Keep an eye on their website for 2025 dates and author events!!

Toronto International Festival of Authors

This multi day event is held in the Harbourfront area of Toronto with various events taking place in September and usually early June. Many author events take place with the opportunity to obtain an autographed copy of the author's most recent work.
