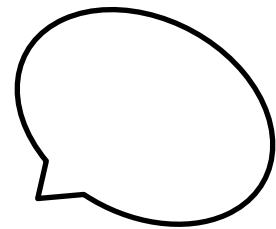

Everybody's Talking

To the Top: The city of Cape Town, South Africa, is really quite a wonder to behold. Located on the country's southwest coast of the South Atlantic Ocean, its most defining feature is Table Mountain, a flat-topped land formation that overlooks the city. Tourists can take a cable car to the top and enjoy a 360 degree view, have a bite to eat, or go for a hike. Although the cable car takes 5 minutes to get to the top you make consider hiking up (or down) one of several trails, ranging from difficult scrambles to longer, but easier, routes.

Famous Tower: The Eiffel Tower is one of the most famous towers in the world. Engineer Gustave Eiffel's company designed and built it over the course of 2 years, completing it in time to stand as the entrance to the 1889 Exhibition Universelle. The tower now reaches 1,063 feet into the sky and is the tallest structure in Paris, France. It held its place as the world's tallest manmade structure for 41 years, until the Chrysler Building in NYC claimed that title in 1930.

Did You Know...

Versatile Actor: British actor Peter Sellers (1925-1980) got his acting start in radio. Later, he starred in such movies as *The Pink Panther* and *Dr. Strangelove*. Both of his parents were vaudeville performers.

Bathtub Race: Since 1967, the city of Nanaimo, BC has hosted an annual bathtub race. Participants race their bathtubs around a course in the harbour. The summer event also includes concerts and a parade.

Camelid Creatures: While Peru is known for being home to lots of alpacas and llamas, its national animal is the vicuña. Also part of the camelid family, the vicuña looks a bit like an alpaca but is smaller.
