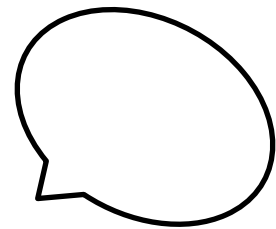

Black Apples: Many different kinds of apples are grown in the world, and most have colours in the red, green or yellow palettes. Not so the Black Diamond apple. These rare apples have black or dark purple skin, and they only grow in certain conditions. They can be grown in the high mountains in Nyingchi, Tibet, where there are drastic temperature differences between night and day. The area receives lots of sunlight and ultraviolet light, which affects the colour of the apples. They are not easy to find in supermarkets; they are usually displayed in gift sets of six or eight.

Luxury Camping: If you merge the words "glamorous" and "camping" you get what some folks call "glamping," which refers to camping in luxury. Under Canvas, a company in the United States, has taken the concept to a high level by offering unique accommodations that are a cross between a traditional tent and an expensive hotel room.

First Female Doctor: Elizabeth Blackwell, born in England in 1821, became the first woman to graduate from a US medical school. She studied at Geneva Medical College in Geneva, NY in 1847, graduated in 1849, and went on to a successful career.
