Anne of Green Gables: Kevin Sullivan adapted the novel by L M Montgomery into a film. Various locations were used for the filming of this work and included Prince Edward Island; Stouffville, Ontario; Jacksons Point, Ontario and Westfield Heritage Village near Rockton. The lead role of Anne Shirley was given to Megan Follows (she has more recently been part of the cast for Reign, Murdoch Mysteries and many others).

A two country library: A library based in Vermont is in a unique location as it crosses the border from the US into Canada. The Haskell Free Library and Opera House sits directly on the border between these two countries. You can walk in from Stanstead, Quebec and walk out into Derby Line, Vermont. You don't need a passport to cross the line running through the building, but you do have to return to your country of origin or risk fines.

Bats in libraries: The Joanina Library at the University of Coimbra in Portugal has a number of bats in residency, but no one is calling for an exterminator as the bats prey on insects that could damage book pages.
