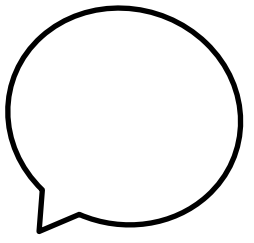

Ephesus Library: The capacity of the library in Ephesus was more than 12,000 scrolls. It was the third richest library in ancient times after the Alexandria and Pergamum libraries. The façade of the Ephesus library has two stories, with Corinthian style columns on the ground floor and three entrances to the building.

Oldest Bookstore: In 2011, the Guinness Book of World Records named the bookstore Livraria Bertrand the oldest, operating bookstore in the world. It was founded in 1732 in Lisbon, Portugal and is located in Lisbon's Chiado neighbourhood.

Did You Know...

Books in Egypt: In ancient Egypt, ships visiting Alexandria were obliged to surrender their books to the Royal Library.

The originals would be kept in the Library of Alexandria and the copies given back to the ships. In theory, the government was obliged to reimburse the original owners, but it would only do so sometimes and rarely adequately.

Human Library: The Human Library is a global movement for social change where 'readers' across the world can check out human 'books' and listen to stories about their lives. It was designed to encourage positive conversations between different types of people to help challenge common prejudices and stereotypes.
